

2025 HIGHLIGHTS

When I sat down to reflect on the year, it initially felt like "business as usual." But as we listed out everything we've accomplished, it became clear just how much we've achieved together—especially considering that all of this is done by volunteers who juggle jobs, families, and life's challenges. Here are some of the key highlights:

Financial Management

With growth comes complexity. This year we:

- Registered for GST and adapted our accounting processes.
- Implemented a cloud-based accounting system.
- Updated our banking structure to meet compliance requirements.
- Introduced processes for loan uniforms and coach equipment deposits.

A special thanks to Victor, who has now completed 12 months as Treasurer and has handled these changes brilliantly.

Coaching Development

Our specialist training courses, initiated by Adrian and Joe last year, continued successfully across all four terms. We also introduced:

- Holiday Programs in partnership with South East Melbourne Phoenix.
- Rep Ready Programs in partnership with South East Melbourne Phoenix.
- Completed 4 full terms of our Vultures Excellence program with weekly sessions for kids
- Plans to record and share coaching sessions in November 2025—keep an eye on the website for updates!

Equipment

We've expanded our coaching packs and storage resources. Soon, we'll launch a booking and access system for coaches to borrow off-court training props stored at Vermont Secondary. Uniforms

Felicity has streamlined uniform operations again in 2025, and we've:

- Added new products like bags and Jibbits.
- Begun designing new girls' uniforms, training tops, and warm-up/achievement tops.
- Secured space at Vermont Secondary to showcase Vultures merchandise—2026 will be exciting in this area!

Child Safety

We've strengthened our child safety standards and aligned with Nunawading Basketball's new mandatory training and forms for all committee members, coaches, and team managers. This is a vital step to ensure a safe environment for every child.

Committee Structure

Thanks to Gavin's leadership, we've evolved from a small committee to a broader structure with AGCs and assistants. With around 30 parents now involved, we're well-positioned to manage growth and compliance.

Communications

Our communications have stepped up significantly—social media updates, game-day photos, award announcements, newsletters, and website improvements. Huge thanks to Michael, Dys, and Derrick for driving this.

In 2025, team sheet fees and court hire remained our biggest areas of expenditure.

However, we're pleased to report that the club achieved healthy savings in court hire this year. Through better utilisation of available courts and improved scheduling, we reduced unnecessary bookings and minimised waste — a big kudo to Yaron and Matt!

Strategic Partnerships

As a club, we have had lots of exiting and beneficial elements happening in this space. We began the year securing a key longer term agreement with Vermont Secondary College, to have exclusive mid week access to the 2 new school stadium courts for our Vultures training. This has allowed 80 teams to train at the new and first class facilities. Making things easier for our Venue Management, but also providing the foundations of a great home base for our teams.

During the year, we also enhanced our partnership South East Melbourne Phoenix. Who have offered prizes and giveaways for our Vultures and Presentations Days, they have given our coaches behind the scenes access to Phoenix training sessions, and we have also offered exclusive Holiday and Rep Ready Training camps.

We started our community sponsorship program. Bringing on board Redwood Café and Intrepid Fitness. Both local businesses who have supported our club, and in return, have offered great benefits to our overall Vultures community, from coffees, milkshakes and fitness training programs. We thank them both for their support.

Finally, we introduced our game day award partnership with Yo Chi. Who have provided vouchers for each team and weekly awards at their franchises around Melbourne. Players have been awarded with weekly vouchers to try some of their amazing frozen yogurts! We even received exclusive access to their stores grand opening in Eastland. Thank you Yo Chi!

In 2026, we are looking to strengthen our community partnerships. We have an opportunity to look for a new main club sponsor, and work and promote small business in our area.

Family Engagement

March 2025 saw the second incarnation of the team photo shoot, where each team was offered a team photo to be taken and then each team member including the coach and team manager were provided a copy.

We had 115 out of a total of 137 teams take up this opportunity from U8 through to

U18's, which was a fantastic turnout. This event was run over 3 days and was warmly welcomed by the Vermont Vultures community. An option was provided for individual photos to be taken with the team photo as well which was warmly received and will be offered again in 2026.

The End of summer season presentation day saw some changes as well, with the event held at our new home Vermont Secondary College gymnasium. The day was a great success run over 3.5 hours with shooting competitions, skill tests and a BBQ for fundraising.

We also had a change to the award presentation with each team having a space to present their team's awards and talk directly to each team member about how they went during the season. This was well received by the Vultures community as it allowed acknowledgement of everyone in the team, not just the award winners.



September 2025 marked the third instalment of Vultures Day again held at our new home at Vermont Secondary.

The event saw approximately 500 people in attendance throughout the event and consisted of the following:

- End of season presentations
- Club Award Presentations
- Large presentation stage for team photos
- Shooting competitions for all age groups
- Skills challenge for all ages
- 5 on 5 Parents competition
- A BBQ and coffee van in full operation
- A silent auction of a signed South East Melbourne Phoenix singlet

MEBA Update

MEBA Juniors continues to grow with the current Summer 25/26 season containing 991 junior teams approximately 7% growth (67 teams). An extra 67 teams equates to an extra 33 games per week, which has been complemented by additional courts coming online.

Our own Vermont Secondary Collage and Wantirna Secondary Collage now hosting games with the association securing long term arrangements with both venues. The association also is looking to bring a couple more stadiums on board over the next 12 months in preparation for the potential redevelopment.

On the development works the association is still progressing their bid for funding for the full redevelopment of Nunawading Stadium and have now secured commitments from both local and federal governments.

This equates to approximately 70% of the funding required as they continue to lobby the state Government for the remaining amount. The funding so far has allowed a more detailed planning to commence so the project is ready to launch if the State Funding is secured

Over the year MEBA has continued to strengthen both its behavioural and child safety framework wanting to set standards in this space rather than follow others.

New bylaws have come into play, fixed a number of issues with the old bylaws such as ball size and ring heights. It will also clarified rules around fill in players and transfers between clubs, with a goal to prevent the creation of super teams.



VICTORIAN JUNIOR BASKETBALL LEAGUE

The Victorian Junior Basketball League (VJBL) is a representative program that helps to develop talented players of all levels across Victoria. Vermont Vultures is a destination club for VJBL players, we had 141 GEBC players who played representative basketball in 2024-25, 106 males and 35 females. This represents approximately 20% of our GEBC players.

Vermont Vultures also had a number of players who received higher honours throughout the course of the year.

Harper Gibbs and Stephanie Finger were selected as part of Victoria's Future Development Program. Allanah Lucas, Poppy Curtis, Lenny Robinson, Cameron Rust, Jake Seo, Charlie Roberts, Oscar Hipfell were selected as part of the Victorian State Development Program. Zara Catto was selected as part of the State Performance Program.

Whilst Vulture Alumni Tom Dammers and Charlie Wilson were selected as part of the National Performance Program and have continued to represent both Victoria and Australia at junior levels

Vermont Vultures Basketball Club remains firmly committed to Child Safety and will continue to work through the updated Child Safety Standards to ensure we create a safe, welcoming and inclusive environment.

The Child Safe Standards are 11 expected outcomes that all organisations who work with children need to ensure they are working to meet. The standards are:

Organisations establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children and young people are respected and valued.

Child Safety

- Processes for complaints and concerns are child-focused.
- Child safety and wellbeing is embedded in organisational leadership, governance and culture.
- Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training.
- Children and young people are empowered about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.
- Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be
- Families and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing.
- 10 Implementation of the Child Safe Standards is regularly reviewed and improved.
- Equity is upheld and diverse needs respected in policy and practice.
- Policies and procedures document how the organisation is safe for children and young people.
- People working with children and young people are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice.

Uniforms Update

A significant growth in team numbers also means a large increase in uniforms supplied!

Vermont Vultures continue to make available loan uniforms allowing new players to the club to hit the court sooner while they await their new uniform.

This process has seen more than 150 uniform sets loaned out to new Vultures over the past couple of seasons.

The Vultures Committee continues to support our newest players in Under 8's and Under 9's offering a free uniform with the club wearing the cost of purchase - breaking down the barriers for involvement in the sport. Over the past two seasons the club has funded more than 150 uniforms for new players in our youngest age group, ensuring they feel part of our community from day 1.

Loan uniforms ensure that Vermont are consistently presented on court in the right way from Round 1, minimizing admin issues.

Furthermore, we continue to offer a range of merchandise for players and supporters to represent the brand. The uniform shop being available for both sales and try-ons during Presentation Day has been a huge success and allows ease of access for those wanting to purchase.

The highlight of Presentation Day from a uniform standpoint was the first showing of the new Vermont Vultures Jibbits. Understanding the target market was key to working through our most recent addition!

A designated sub-committee is currently looking at girls cut singlets to ensure comfort is front of mind for all our players when they hit the court. On top of this we are working on a design for a warm-up top to hopefully be available in the coming months.

Vermont Vultures coaches once again present professionally in both seasons with the hoodies and polos being offered throughout the year. Our coaches are well supported with Coaches bags being readily available at season commencement



Communications

Vermont Vultures communication has increased in 2025 with email blasts providing more details around our sponsorships and benefits to the Vultures community through community partners. These communications include:
